Through comprehensive analysis, it aims to formulate policy recommendations to strengthen Korea-EU security ties, contributing to peace and stability in the region and evaluates the implications of a potential EU-ROK transcontinental security partnership. By fostering a deeper understanding of the strategic drivers behind their actions, the project seeks to contribute to the discourse on global security and international cooperation in defense-oriented domains.
