

**Project title:** Strategies for Countering Disinformation in the Baltic States

The aim of the project is to analyze methods of combating disinformation in Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia. The project is intended to provide practical recommendations for Poland and other EU states regarding building resilience to disinformation.

Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia are the only countries that were part of the former Soviet Union that currently belong to both the European Union and the North Atlantic Alliance, which makes their information space particularly vulnerable to Russian influence. In the indicated Baltic states, the victims of disinformation are mainly Russian-speaking minorities, which Russia uses as a tool for pursuing its interests in the region. The Baltic states possess valuable experience and practical knowledge about effective methods of countering disinformation and minimizing its consequences for the societies affected by it.

Beyond analyzing legal regulations and strategic documents, the project assumes conducting interviews with representatives of administration, media, civil society, scientists, and experts actively engaged in activities related to combating disinformation in the indicated states. This will allow for the identification of best practices in the field of combating disinformation, media education, and cooperation both within state structures and within international structures.
